3. Also consider that past requests to separate students may not be known, so if there are still issues you would like us to know about, please drop us a note!

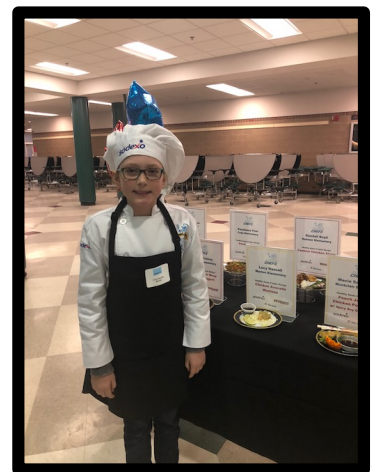
Please keep in mind...teacher assignments can and will change in the coming months. We will be very deliberate about formulating the class lists for next year so that your child has a positive, productive experience.
